

Warsaw Guide

Flying to Warsaw

The best airport to fly to is Chopin, it is nicely connected to the city center and an Uber ride to the center is not going to cost more than 10-12 Euros. An alternative is to use the bus or train, the journey to the city will be 2-3 Euros.



If you are flying to Modlin the Uber will be more around 40-50 Euros and the journey might take up to 1 hour and a half so please plan accordingly. The bus ride to the city is only 6-7 Euros but it might take up to 2 hours and a half.

Going around



Warsaw is one of the safest cities in Europe, also at night, and has an efficient public transportation system. You can get around town for as little as 1 euro per trip on the Metro, bus, or tram - to navigate this conveniently, you can download the [Jakdojade](#) app on your phone. Uber and Bolt serve the city well and a fare of about 20 minutes will cost around 5 euros. You can also rent electric scooters and bicycles using the same apps, and you will find them all over town.

When choosing a hotel or a restaurant don't be afraid of the distance, getting around will be the last of your worries.



What to see and do in Wawa

Warsaw offers a lot of activities and things to see and do during the day. The city is full of parks and promenades. The museum scene is rich and fascinating.

1. Walk along the Vistula River

You can take a walk here, rent a bike and see the Świętokrzyski bridge, or the Karowa pedestrian bridge that connects the city to the area of Praga.

2. Warsaw Uprising Museum

This is probably the most important museum in Warsaw. It tells the story of what the city had to go through during the Uprising that led to the liberation of the city during WW2

3. Be Happy Museum

If you're into selfies and just want to have a laugh, this museum about social media might just be the place for you. Let me repeat this, this is a museum about social media and selfies. Don't say we didn't warn you!

4. Polin Museum of Jewish History

This museum is an architectural masterpiece and a place of commemoration for Jewish history in Poland. The exhibition is stunning.

5. Lazienki Park - The Lazienki Park is one of Warsaw most important open parks. It used to be the King's garden but now anyone can feel like a king. You get bonus points for spotting peacocks.

6. Walk through Warsaw Old Town - Warsaw Old Town was completely demolished and rebuilt after WW2, you have the chance to visit the place and walk around. In the old town, you will find loads of tourist attractions, churches, cafes and restaurants which we usually do not recommend, but hey, it's your time, your money!

7. Walk and Shopping in Chmielna - Chmielna & Plac Pięciu Rogów is an eclectic area of Warsaw with loads of shops pubs cafes and restaurants, it is the ideal hang-out place if you want to meet people and have a drink or buy yourself something cool.

8. Copernicus Science Museum

- If you're into technology and science you can visit the Copernicus center, an interesting museum and planetarium with a lot of hands on learning attractions inside.

9. Get on top of The Palace of Culture and Science

- This is the highest viewpoint in Warsaw on one of the most controversial buildings of this city, built by the Russians as a gift to the people, the once most hated building in the country is now one of the main landmarks, with cinemas and theatres, a museum, a swimming pool, and a concert hall.



Hotels:

1. Puro Hotel - Really nice chain of hotels with really cool bar and restaurant.
2. Motel One Tamka Street - New, comfortable, conveniently located with affordable rooms.
3. Moxy Warsaw Praga -
4. Four Points by Warsaw Sheraton Mokotów - Mid way between the city center and the airport, but not too far out. Comfortable and with good rates.
5. Sava Boutique Hotel - Worth recommending for the location, reasonable prices and standard.
6. Intercontinental Warszawa - Worth booking if you want the most instagrammable shot of you in a jacuzzi on the top floor, with the Palace of Culture in the back.

Clubs:



1. RITUAL Cocktail Club - Visit Mazowiecka - the party street of Warsaw and have fun all night long. This place usually has live music, great cocktails, and opens till 5AM.
2. Level 27 - This is a roof-top club, with a decent view, DJs and plenty of space to dance. Only open on weekends, and bear in mind that it is considered to be on the expensive side.
3. Smolna Techno - Be prepared for a tough selection (no collar shirts, no formal clothes) and to have the cameras on your phone covered due to a strict no photo policy. Three stages of great techno.
4. Gatsby Warsaw - This is an exclusive place for people who like to show off and spend money. The music is great but you are supposed to wear no logos. Best if you are on the guest list.

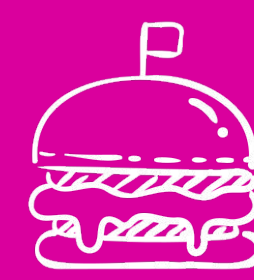
Pubs & Bars (in no particular order):

1. U Szwejka - Beer, schnitzels, Central European food, and can fit a larger reservation.
2. Jabeerwocky Craft Beer Pub - Super famous for their beer and quickly served food in central Warsaw.
3. Plan B - Trendy & laid-back community venue with a stylish bar & space for live music, from jazz to rock.
4. Cuda - Casual plaza-front option providing pizza & beer in an industrial-style venue with outdoor seating.
5. Zaremba Cafe - designer cocktails in a very upscale location.
6. Backroom Bar - Classic prohibition style bar with decor from 20-30s, live jazz music on Thursdays and exceptional cocktails. It's a hidden bar so you really need to look for it - follow your gut and don't bother looking for signs.
7. Aura Bar - this is the place where cocktails are served with fresh oysters.



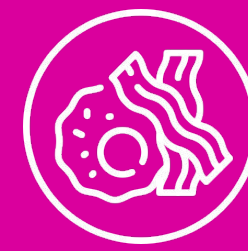
Restaurants (in no particular order):

1. Pezzo - the best Neapolitan pizza according to Fabio Palvelli. Small restaurant on Francuska street - a charming street on the left side of Vistula where you can enjoy authentic pizza on amazing dough. Made by passionate Pizzaiolos.
2. Bar Rascal - a place known for its natural wines and great food selection. Grab a few plates and enjoy your night. Hip, casual, for smaller groups, or a date.
3. Bibenda - a contemporary eatery offering seasonal plates that you can share. Great cocktails and lots of options for vegetarians and vegans. These guys are usually busy and take no reservations but the line moves quickly and it's worth it.
4. Hoza Argentinian Steakhouse - Great meat restaurant with a huge wine selection. Nice outdoor area and can accommodate medium to large groups.
5. Nicoletta Warszawa - Italian/Polish fusion food in a nice romantic setting. Great selection of wine and cocktails. Ideal for an intimate evening.
6. Syrena Irena - the ideal place to try out the famous Polish pierogi. Casual, quick and home made.
7. Pizzaiolo - modern Italian Pizza with a funky Polish twist.
8. Rosalia - modern Polish cuisine with a twist of contemporary flavors.
9. Wódka Gessler - traditional Polish food in a buzzing modern setting.
10. Elixir - A restaurant where you get a menu with vodka pairing. It's a great experience, even for those who are not particular fans of Vodka.



Breakfast + brunch places:

1. Być Może - Multiple locations, try the benedict eggs with Bacon or salmon and spinach. It is a chain so look for the closest location.
2. Vincent - Great selection of breads and French bakery. It is a chain so look for the closest location.
3. Bułkę przez Bibułkę - Casual breakfast, very hip. Small locations so there might be a line. It is a chain so look for the closest location.
4. Charlotte - Serves breakfast all day long.
5. SAM - The classic feel-at-home kind of place with incredible coffee, try the cortado.



Night food:

You could go and just get a kebab - those are available pretty much anywhere around the city center, especially on a weekend night. But why would you? Warsaw never sleeps. Get some great food instead.

1. Ćma - great food, all day, all night. You will be amazed.
2. Warszawa Wschodnia - 24 cookery with an amazing location.
3. Pianka z Tanka - nice food and great service for 24hr a day.



Food courts and Gallerias:

1. Fabryka Norblina - A modern location with shops and nice dining places. No matter if you want to have breakfast or lunch, this place has got anything you want.
2. Hala Koszyki - The Warsaw food court gem. Have lunch there and before you leave grab one of their amazing gelati.
3. Elektrownia Powiśle - An eclectic mall with a great food court, here you can find any type of food you like, from Turkish to Italian, Polish cuisine to burgers and fries.
4. Browary Warszawskie - One of the most famous food courts in Warsaw. Great design and nice cozy location.
5. Złote Tarasy - Great for shopping, this shopping mall is famous for its architecture, but don't expect more than fast food chains when it comes to food. Very central, usually pretty busy.
